BRITNEY MOUTRAY ACHIEVES CERTIFIED DIABETES EDUCATOR STATUS

The National Certification Board for Diabetes Educators (NCBDE) announced that IVCH dietitian Brittney Moutray, MS, RD, LDN, has achieved Certified Diabetes Educator® (CDE®) status by successfully completing the Certification Examination for Diabetes Educators.



Candidates must meet rigorous eligibility requirements to be able to take the exam.

Achieving certification status demonstrates to people with diabetes and employers that the health care professional possesses distinct and specialized knowledge, thereby promoting quality of care for people with diabetes. Currently, there are more than 18,800 diabetes educators who hold NCBDE certification.

Moutray is a licensed, registered dietitian with seven years of experience who has been employed at IVCH since 2013. She is a program dietitian for IVCH's Diabetes Center for Excellence, the hospital's comprehensive, educational program accredited by the American Association of Diabetes Educators. Deb Redd, RN, CDE®, another diabetes center staff member, is also a certified diabetes educator.

The NCBDE was established in 1986 to develop and administer a certification program for health care professionals who teach individuals with diabetes how to manage their disease. The mission of the organization is to define, develop, maintain, and protect the certification and credentialing process to promote quality diabetes education.

IVCH FOUNDATION TO AWARD TWO SCHOLARSHIPS

The IVCH Foundation is now accepting scholarship applications for the Carol Greening Memorial Nursing Scholarship and the Dolores "Dee" Heflebower Scholarship.

The \$400 Greening scholarship is open to students who have been accepted into a college nursing program and who live in LaSalle, Bureau or Putnam County. It was established by the family of the late Carol Greening, an IVCH nurse manager who died in 2000.

The Heflebower scholarship is a \$3,000 award. Applicants must have completed the first year of a college nursing program and be LaSalle, Bureau or Putnam County residents. Anne and Don Baker established the scholarship in memory of their daughter, the late Dolores "Dee" Heflebower.

Applications for both scholarships are due May 1. Applications are available on the 2 South and 3 South nursing units, in the Human Resources office, or in the Foundation office on 2R.

ASBESTOS REMOVAL BEGINS

Asbestos abatement has begun in the north wing of IVCH, the first step in preparing the oldest part of the hospital for demolition.

Work began first on floor 3R April 4. Asbestos being removed from the building is being placed in a sealed dumpster parked between the MRI trailer and the emergency department entrances. Before going

into the dumpster, asbestos containing materials are placed in plastic leak proof and air tight bags. The contents of the bags are sprayed with water until adequately wet and then tied off and double bagged and sealed with duct tape.

The bags are taken to the enclosed dumpster, which is lined with protective plastic and sealed with duct tape. Bags that are torn or leaking are not allowed in the dumpster and are sealed again.

"Only airtight bags will be 'wasted out' with no exceptions. The dumpster will only be open during waste out; otherwise the dumpster will be closed and remain under lock and key," said Tommy Hobbs, IVCH chief executive officer.

The removal process is expected to take about four weeks.
